RULES:

THE RACING RULES OF SAILING AS PUBLISHED BY U.S. SAILING SHALL APPLY, EXCEPT AS MODIFIED BY THE NEW YORK SAILING CLUB'S RACING INSTRUCTIONS, OR THIS NOTICE OF RACE.

1250	-	WARNING	-	WHITE SHAPE
1255	-	PREP	-	BLUE SHAPE
0100	-	START	-	RED SHAPE

STARTING LINE:

BETWEEN A WHITE FLAG ON THE COMMITTEE BOAT AND R 2" IN THE VICINITY OF BIG TOM NEAR THE SOUTHWESTERN TIP OF CITY ISLAND.

COURSE:

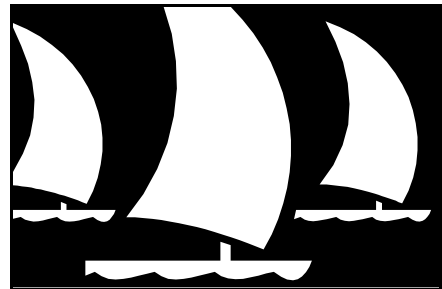
AROUND THE SOUTHERN END OF CITY ISLAND, THENCE CLOCKWISE OR COUNTER CLOCKWISE AROUND HART ISLAND, KEEPING R "46", GONG G "1", CAN "3" AND THE BLAUZES TO PORT (IF GOING COUNTER CLOCKWISE) OR TO STARBOARD (IF GOING CLOCKWISE). **NO VESSEL WILL CUT THROUGH THE BLAUZES.**

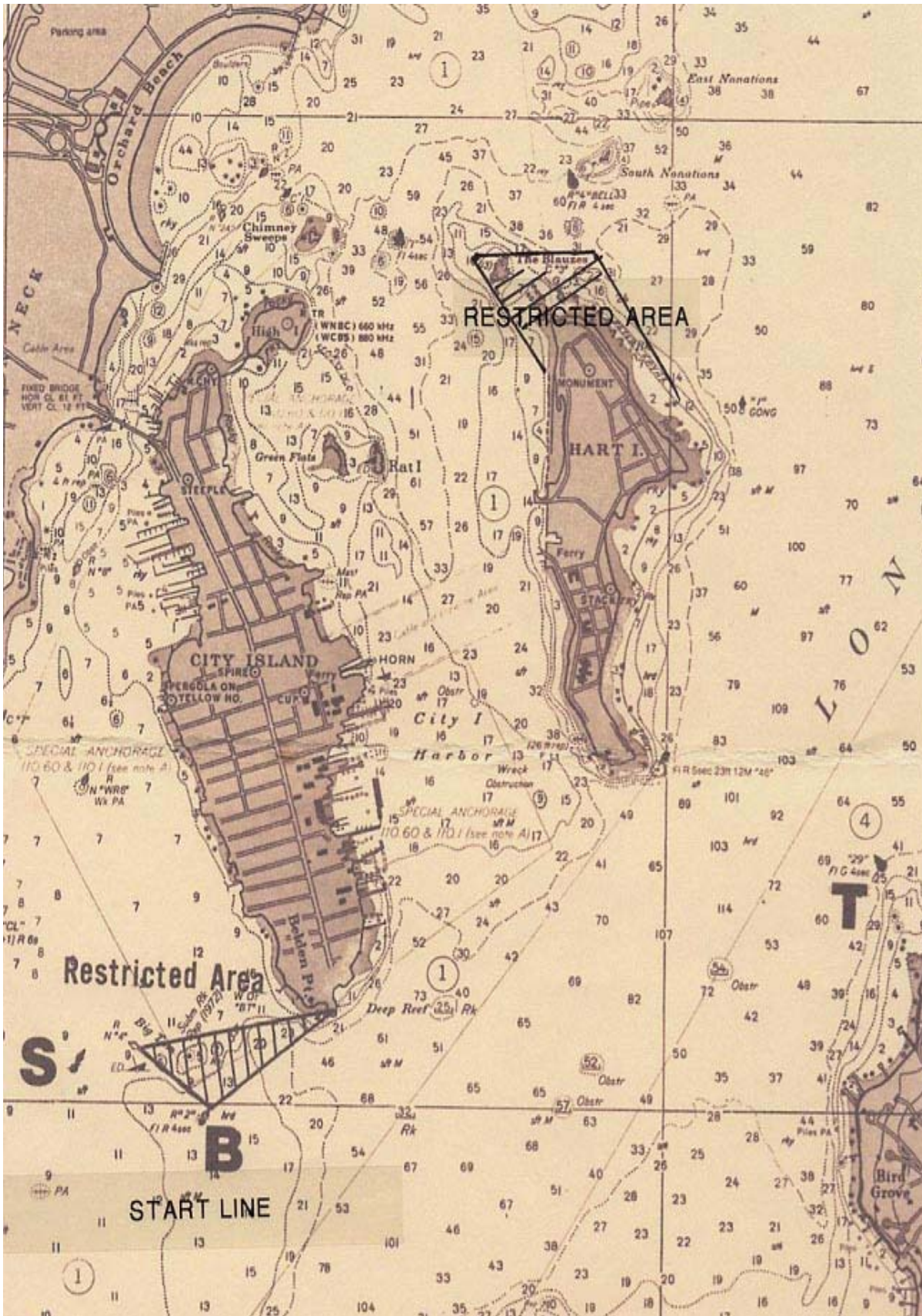
FINISH LINE:

BETWEEN A WHITE FLAG ON THE COMMITTEE BOAT AND R "2" NEAR BIG TOM.

TIME LIMIT:

FOUR HOURS. ANY BOAT FINISHING AFTER THE TIME LIMIT SHALL BE SCORED DNF. AT LEAST ONE BOAT MUST FINISH WITHIN THE TIME LIMIT TO COUNT THE RACE AS OFFICIAL.





Going into Commission Dinner and Around Hart Island Race for a Case

The annual Race for a Case around Hart Island has few rules. The only one that matters is no vessel may cut The Blauzes. Start time is 1:00 PM. One may sail clockwise or counter-clockwise and the time limit is four hours. Rules of the road do apply, of course, and actual time is usually under two hours. All competitors will receive a Notice of Race and a mini-chart. See chart attached to April newsletter. The prize is a case of beer or a bottle of wine and bragging rights. If you need crew or want to crew, call Fleet Captain Scott Stevenson at (631) 864-9584 and he will try to make match-ups.

The Going-into-Commission Dinner will be a buffet at the Stuyvesant Yacht Club on City Island. The menu will be appetizers during cocktail hour, salmon, chicken, shrimp and manicotti, roasted potatoes, vegetables. Desserts will be provided. The price is \$40 for food only. A cash bar will be open for beer, wine and spirits throughout. The case or bottle will be awarded to the winning boat and our season will officially be open.
